HISTORICAL SUMMARY

Since 2018, I have operated my second business, [The Centre of Serendipity](#), conducting professional and personal development for individuals and teams (managing all financial reporting and marketing). I have self-published two personal growth books, am a registered publisher and certified results coach.

I have extensive experience working as team leader, team-member, and individually; with expertise in various areas; and have broad experience in adult education. I have facilitated cultural change, managed the establishment of a new research centre and the merge of two large research centres into a priority research centre which operated for more than 10 years. I have been described as patient, empathic, empowering, creative, proactive and excellent in synthesising information from various standpoints to come up with the best way forward. I have managed research projects, transition and start-up projects, and conducted other professional and academic work.

Prior to establishing [The Centre of Serendipity](#), I was contracted to establish a new research flagship for **Hunter Cancer Research Alliance**. For **Calvary Mater Newcastle (CMN)**, as Research Manager – Clinician-Researcher Education, Development & Support for the Department of Radiation Oncology, I worked to foster and develop growth by providing self-sustaining resources, and training and supporting staff. I utilised [i-PARIHS methodology to implement health systems innovation](#), providing on-the-job research training for medical and allied health staff, as well as higher degree research students (via individual training sessions, newsletters, online resources and workshops).

Since 2017, I have been invited to speak at various international conferences, about my work in mental health research (but also on nutrition in psychotic illness). I am a foundation member of the Academy of Clinical Education, and a fully-trained experienced adult facilitator. Since 2005, I have taught various courses at The University of Newcastle (**UON**) in Psychology, Medicine, and Radiation Therapy (by invitation), using face-to-face tutoring, lab demonstration, and online support, as well as Honours, Masters and PhD co-supervision in Nutrition and Dietetics (to completion).

Since 1996, I have had research experience in project start-up, management and completion; using qualitative and quantitative methodologies; working for Hunter Valley Research Foundation, UON, Hunter New England Mental Health (**HNEMH**), Macquarie University, Hunter Medical Research Institute (**HMRI**), Schizophrenia Research Institute (**SRI**, now NeuRA) and CMN. I am a proficient statistician and author. My grantsmanship has proven successful as an external grant consultant for Trans-Tasman Radiation Oncology Group (**TROG**) among others.

As a mature-aged student, I completed my [Honours](#) study and then my [PhD](#), in which I designed a behavioural and neuroimaging paradigm to explore brain function differences between people with schizophrenia and healthy controls (PhD awarded 2013; [review](#) published internationally in 2017; 'how-to' paper published internationally 2020). During my PhD, I job-shared the role of Hunter-New England (**HNE**) Site Coordinator on the Australian national **Survey of High Impact Psychosis (SHIP, 2009-2010)**, which expanded my track record into epidemiology (3 internationally-published papers).

Additionally, I have over 14 years' experience in psychological assessment: I've provided clinically diagnostic, cognitive, intellectual and functional assessment of persons aged 16 years and over, having trained my own research staff; and others' staff by request [[SAPS](#), [SANS](#), [DIP-DM](#), [RBANS](#), [SCID](#), [WAIS](#), [WMS](#) and other structured and semi-structured interviews].
